
MATERIAL CHECKLIST


"BIG" BEADS:

GDUO-A 8x5 mm 2-hole GemDuo Color: Polychrome Black Raspberry For a 14.5 cm / 5.71 inch (without clasp) bracelet: 12 pcs	
GDUO-B 8x5 mm 2-hole GemDuo Color: Tropical Passion Pink For a 14.5 cm / 5.71 inch (without clasp) bracelet: 32 pcs	
RULLA 3x5 mm 2-hole Rulla Duet Color: Polychrome Mix Berry For a 14.5 cm / 5.71 inch (without clasp) bracelet: 32 pcs	
CANDY 8 mm 2-hole Candy bead Color: Pastel Bordeaux For a 14.5 cm / 5.71 inch (without clasp) bracelet: 4 pcs	
SEED BEADS:	
R15 15/0 Japanese seed beads Color: Miyuki nr. 94220 Duracoat Galvanized Eggplant For a 14.5 cm / 5.71 inch (without clasp) bracelet: 147 pcs	
COMPONENTS AND TOOLS:	
two thin beading needles, 0.12 mm smoke-grey Fireline or Wildfire clasp and extension chain thread-burner or sharp scissors, bead mat	

Size of the finished piece of beadwork: cca. 14.5×2.6 cm $/ 5.71 \times 1.02$ inch without the clasp and extension chain.







Don't force the needle through two beads at once. GemDuos and Rullas can be fragile, even if they are of bigger sizes.


You will work with two needles on one thread. Try to start exactly in the middle. If you notice for some reason that one needle is running short, then you can always use the other one for the extra thread paths, just do the move clockwise instead of counter-clockwise and vice-versa.

The "flowers" can be wobly before they are entirely finished. Lay them flat on your bead mat and push them down with one hand while sewing with the other. Don't worry, after adding all the beads and making the necessary passes they will lay completely flat.


Be careful with proper tension though - it's very important to keep it tight!

Criss crossing through one or more beads means to sew through the bead(s) with one needle from one side, with the other needle from the other side.


INSTRUCTIONS




1. Pick up the clasp, then add (2) R15 on both needles. Criss-cross through (1) R15. Pick up (3) R15 on both needles, then criss-cross through a GDUO-A.



2. Criss-cross through the open hole of the GDUO-A. Pick up R15A + GDUO-A + R15 on both needles, then criss-cross through a GDUO-B.



3. Sew once more through the beads picked up in the previous step to strengthen the connections. Criss-cross through the empty hole of the GDUO-B.



4. Pick up (1) RULLA on each needle. Criss-cross through the open hole of each RULLA.














5. On one needle pick up (6) RULLAs and sew through the (2) RULLA picked up in the previous step. Retrace the thread path with the other needle from the opposite direction.




6. Pick up (1) CANDY. Sew through (2) RULLA on the opposite side of the circle, then sew back through the open hole of the CANDY. Sew through (2) RULLA. The thread should exit at the same point as at the beginning of this step.

7. Work with one needle. Sew through the CANDY and pick up (5) R15. Sew back through the otherhole of the CANDY. Pick up (8) R15, then sew once more through the lower hole, in the same direction.



8. Pick up (5) R15. Sew through the upper hole of the CANDY. Pick up (8) R15, then sew once more through the same hole in the same direction.
















9. Sew around twice through all the R15 beads you picked up during the previous step. Make sure to start and finish between the grouping of (5) and (8) R15. Sew through the upper hole of the CANDY.




10. Sew through to exit the top of RULLA + GDUO-B + RULLA. Repeat with second needle. Fill in GDUO-Bs all around between the outer holes of RULLAs, then continue until you reach the GDUO-B on the opposite side of the motif.



11. Repeat steps 2-10 until you have a long enough bracelet (probably 4-5 flowers). Finish after a small motif built like in steps 2-3, using only GDUO-A beads.





12. Criss-cross through the open hole of GEM-DUO-A. Pick up (3) R15 on both needles, then criss-cross through (1) R15.

13. Work with one needle. Pick up (2) R15 + the last link of the extension chain + (2) R15. Sew through the R15 you were exiting at the beginning of this step.

Retrace the thread path with the other needle in the opposite direction.

14. Secure and trim both thread ends! Congratulations, your bracelet is finished.
