

BONDELI GINKO RAINBOW BRACELET
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Create your own personal rainbow with these yummy Bondeli finish Ginko beads.

Skill level: Beginner and up
Techniques to know: Stitching with two-holed beads, adding/ending thread
Finished length: 7 inches including the clasp

## MATERIALS/TOOLS

17 pieces each of Ginkos in 7 colors
3 grams $15^{\circ}$ seed beads
2 grams $11^{\circ}$ seed beads
Toggle clasp
2 size 4 mm soldered jump rings
2 size 5 mm jump rings
6 lb Fireline (crystal)
Size 11 beading needle
Scissor/2 pairs of Pliers

## DESIGNER TIPS:

Check all holes of two-holed beads before stitching to make sure they are not clogged.
Each completed row should have a total of seventeen Ginkos.
The Ginko bead hole orientation will be designated as right and left point, and right and left curve.


FIGURE 1 - COLOR 1
Step 1. On two yards of Fireline, string a stop bead leaving a 12 -inch tail. String one Ginko (left point hole), one $15^{\circ}$, one $11^{\circ}$ and one $15^{\circ}$. Continue this pattern until you have sixteen units.

Step 2. String one Ginko (left point hole), two $15^{\circ}$, one $11^{\circ}$ and two $15^{\circ}$, and sew through the open hole the same Ginko.

## FIGURE 2 - COLOR 2

Step 3. String one Ginko (left curve hole) and sew through the Ginko (right curve hole) added in previous row. Repeat fifteen times.

Step 4. String one Ginko (left curve hole), three $15^{\circ}$, one $11^{\circ}$ and three $15^{\circ}$, and sew through the open hole of the same Ginko.

## FIGURE 3 - COLOR 3

Step 5. String one Ginko (left point hole) and sew through the Ginko (right point hole) added in previous row. Repeat fifteen times.

Step 6. String one Ginko (left point hole), two $15^{\circ}$, one $11^{\circ}$ and two $15^{\circ}$, and sew through the open hole the same Ginko.

FIGURE 4 - COLOR 4
Step 7. Repeat Steps 3 and 4.
FIGURE 5 - COLOR 5
Step 8. Repeat Steps 5 and 6.
FIGURE 6 - COLOR 6
Step 9. Repeat Steps 3 and 4
FIGURE 7 - COLOR 7
Step 10. Repeat Step 5.

Step 11. String one $15^{\circ}$, one $11^{\circ}$, one $15^{\circ}$, and sew through the next Ginko. Repeat to end of the row. String one $15 / 0$ and sew back through all the Ginkos and seed beads on this edge. Secure thread within bracelet and trim excess.

Step 12. Remove stop bead, rethread tail, string one $15^{\circ}$ and sew back through all the Ginkos and seed beads on this edge. Secure thread within the bracelet and trim excess.

NOTE: For added wearing durability, secure a new two-yard length of Fireline within the piece and sew through the entire bracelet again.

## FIGURE 8 - ATTACH SOLDERED RING TO GINKO CURVES

Step 13. Secure a new 14 -inch length of Fireline within the bracelet and exit the two $15^{\circ}$ over the right curve hole of the second Ginko (color 3).

Step 14. String three $15^{\circ}$, one $11^{\circ}$ and one soldered jump ring. Sew back through the $11^{\circ}$. String three $15^{\circ}$ and sew through the two $15^{\circ}$ over the left curve hole of the third Ginko (color 5). Repeat thread path once more (not shown in the illustrations), secure thread within the bracelet and trim excess.

## FIGURE 9 - ATTACH SOLDERED RING TO GINKO POINTS

Step 15. Secure a new 14 -inch length of Fireline within the bracelet and exit the three $15^{\circ}$ over the left point Ginko hole of the middle Ginko (color 4).

Step 16. String three $15^{\circ}$, one $11^{\circ}$ and one soldered jump ring. Sew back through the $11^{\circ}$. String three $15^{\circ}$ and sew through the three $15^{\circ}$ over the right point hole of the same Ginko. Repeat thread path once more (not shown in the illustrations), secure thread within the bracelet and trim excess.

## ATTACH CLASP TO BRACELET

Step 17. Using pliers, open a jump ring, insert toggle bar, attach to soldered ring on point edge of bracelet, and close the jump ring.

Step 18. Using pliers, open a jump ring, insert toggle ring, attach to soldered ring on curve edge of bracelet, and close the jump ring.
