# Bracelet SO Cute

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For a 19 cm/7.5 inch piece of beadwork not including the button and loop:
52 CzechMate Crescent (A)

50 Nib-Bits TM (B)
1 g Seed Beads size 11/0 (C)


2 hole button

Ko thread or fire line
Size 10 beading needle
scissors


1) Pick up $2 \mathrm{~A}, 1 \mathrm{~B}$ (use the top hole), 2 A and pass back through the second hole of the last $2 A$ you picked up. Pick up 1B (use the top hole) and pass through the second hole of the first 2A you picked up in this step.
2) Pick up 1 B (use the top hole), 2 A and pass back through the other holes of the 2 A . Pick up 1 B and pass through the first holes of the next $2 A$ you picked up in the previous step. Pass back through the second holes. Pass a second time through the first 3 beads you picked up in
 this step.

3) Repeat step 2 till your bracelet has the correct length. A $19 \mathrm{~cm} / 7,5$ inch bracelet has 26 groups of 2A beads.
4) Pass through the right side holes of the last 2 A you added and pass through the bottom hole of the next B. Start adding $C$ beads between the bottom holes of the B beads.


5) Pass through the last 2A of your bracelet. Pick up 5C, your button, pick up 2 or 3 C (to fit between the button holes) and pass back through the second hole of your button. Pick up 2C and pass through the third $C$ you picked up in this step. Pick up 2C and pass through the left side holes of the 2A, pass back through the right side holes. Pass several times through all beads and button to make a firm connection between your bracelet and the button.
6) End the previous step passing through the left side holes of the first 2 A beads. Pass through the bottom hole of the next $B$ and add a $C$ bead between each $B$ bead passing through the bottom holes along this side of the bracelet. After you passed the bottom hole of the last $B$, pass through the next 2 A .

7) Pick up 24 C beads (adjust this number of beads( adjust this number of beads to fit your size button), pass through the second $C$ bead you picked up. Pick up 1C and pass through the right side holes of the $A$ beads. Pass back through the left side holes. Repeat this thread path several times finish and trim your thread.

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
