## HOOP-STAR EARRINGS 2.0

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Ginkos beads are now the star attraction in the ring.

Skill level: Confident beginner and up Techniques: Stitching with two-hole beads Finished length: 2"

## MATERIALS

- 0.5 grams size $15^{\circ}$ seed beads
- 16 size $11^{\circ}$ seed beads
- 16 GemDuos
- 16 Ginkos
- 16 SuperDuos
- 2 size 40 mm ear hoops with inner top loop
- Pair of ear wires
- 6lb. Fireline ${ }^{\text {TM }}$
- Size 11 beading needle

- Scissors/Pliers


## TIPS:

- Check that all holes of any two-hole beads are clear before stitching.
- Be careful not to skip any beads when retracing a thread path.
- Second thread paths are not shown in the illustrations.


## COMPONENT

## FIGURE 1

Step 1 (red thread). Thread one yard of Fireline on a needle. String eight SuperDuos. Sew through all the SuperDuos again to form a circle, and knot the threads leaving a small tail. Sew away from the knot through one bead and step up by reversing direction through the open hole of the same SuperDuo. Weave in and trim the tail.

Step 2 (black thread). String one GemDuo and sew through the next SuperDuo. Repeat seven more times. Sew through all the beads again and step up by reversing direction and sewing through the top hole of the first GemDuo strung.

Step 3. String one $15^{\circ}$, one Ginko (curved end), six $15^{\circ}$ s and sew through the second hole (tip) of the Ginko. String one $15^{\circ}$ and sew through the next GemDuo.

Step 4. Repeat Step 3 seven more times. Continue through to exit the first three $15^{\circ}$ s over the first Ginko added in Step 3.

## ATTACH COMPONENT TO HOOP

Step 5. Position the component inside the ear hoop with a Ginko lined up directly underneath the inside loop. NOTE: Make sure that the GemDuos are right side up before stitching.

Step 6. String one $11^{\circ}$. Sewing from the front to the back, sew through the loop and back through the $11^{\circ}$. Continue through the next eleven beads (three $15^{\circ}$ s, Ginko, $15^{\circ}$, GemDuo, Ginko, and three $15^{\circ}$ s over the Ginko).

Step 7. String one $11^{\circ}$, sew over the hoop (from front to back) and sew back through the $11^{\circ}$ just added. Continue through the next eleven beads as outlined in Step 6.

Step 8. Repeat Step 7 six more times to attach each Ginko around the hoop.
Step 9. Following the existing thread paths of Figures 2 and 3, sew again through all the beads to reinforce the connections of the component to the hoop. Secure the thread within the beadwork and trim the excess.

Step 10. Use pliers to attach an ear wire to the outside loop of the earring hoop.
