

LOOM BRACELET WITH PICOT EDGE by Sara Ellis



This beautiful bracelet kicks basic looming up a notch! Learn to create and easy picot edge that can catapult your beading to the next level. The greens and blues in this bracelet are reminiscent of the beautiful budding blooms of early spring. Carry the feeling of birth and renewal all year long with this lovely design.

SUPPLIES:

- John Bead Angle Blue Mix Czech Glass Seed Beads 6/0
- Beadalon Jewel Loom
- Beadalon Wild ire Bead Weaving Thread, Green 006"
- Beadalon GS Hypo Cement
- Beadalon Hard Beading Needles 10
- Bead Landing Clasp Ribbon Clamp
- Beadalon Findings Variety Pack
- Scissors
- Measuring tape or ruler

Instructions:

- 1. Using a measuring tape, determine the length of your bracelet.
- 2. Using the Wildfire while it is still on the spool, create four warps on the Jewel Loom.
- 3. Cut 6' of Wildfire and thread the end onto a hard beading needle.
- 4. Leave 10 to 12 inches of tail. Bead the number of rows to match the length you measured for your bracelet, minus one inch for clasp.
- 5. Reinforce the beads.
- 6. Create selvage at the top and bottom of the bracelet and apply glue.
- 7. Cut 5' of Wildfire and tread the end onto a hard beading needle.
- 8. Create picot edge on both sides of the bracelet and weave in ends.
- 9. Cut the bracelet from the loom.
- 10. Attach ribbon clamp to each selvage end.
- 11. Use pliers to attach jump rings and clasp.
