






LACEY GINKO BRACELET

Ginko Duos and seed beads woven in a lacey pattern create the open and airy feel of this bracelet.

Skill Level: Intermediate beginner

Techniques to know: Right angle weave, ending/adding thread, familiar with two-holed beads **Finished size:** approximately 6 5/8-inches without clasp (~16.8cm) in length.

MATERIALS

- (54) Ginkos
- (3g) Size 8/0 Miyuki seed beads
- (2g) Size 11/0 Miyuki seed beads
- (1.5g) Size 15/0 Miyuki seed beads
- 3 Strand slide tube clasp
- (6) Size 5mm Jump rings
- Thread Fireline 6lb.

- Size 11 or 12 beading needle
- Pliers to work jump rings
- Scissors or thread zapper

NOTE: Check all holes of any multi-holed beads to make sure they are clear before use. Just peek at them as you work. It's worth the extra time!

FIRST ROW

- **1.** On approximately 2.5 yards of thread, pick up Ginko (left hole), 15/0, 11/0, 8/0, 11/0, 15/0, and go back through second hole of Ginko just picked up. Leave about a six-inch tail thread to weave in as soon as possible. You may need a stop bead on your tail thread. (Figure 1)
- **2**. Pick up 8/0, Ginko, 15/0, 11/0, 8/0, 11/0, 15/0, and go back through second hole of Ginko just picked up. Repeat twenty-five more times for a bracelet measuring approximately 6 and 5/8 inches without clasp. There must be an odd number of Ginkos in this row for tutorial to work. (Figure 2)

NOTE: Each repeat in Step 2 adds approximately one half of an inch to length of bracelet.

SECOND ROW

- **3**. Pick up 8/0, 11/0, three 15/0s, three 11/0s, three 15/0s, 11/0, 8/0, Ginko, 15/0, 11/0, 8/0, 11/0, 15/0, and go back through second hole of Ginko just picked up. (Figure 3)
- **4**. Pick up 8/0, Ginko, 15/0, 11/0, and go through 8/0 on first row of beadwork. Pick up 11/0, 15/0, and go back through second hole of Ginko. Pick up 8/0, Ginko, 15/0, 11/0, 8/0, 11/0, 15/0, and go back through second hole of Ginko just picked up. Repeat all of this step twelve more times to reach end of beadwork. (Figure 4)

POP OUTER POINTS

- **5.** Pick up 8/0, 11/0, three 15/0s, three 11/0s, three 15/0s, 11/0, 8/0, and go through Ginko on first row. *Go through 15/0, two 11/0s (skipping under 8/0), 15/0, Ginko, 8/0, Ginko, 15/0, 11/0, 8/0, 11/0, 15/0, Ginko, 8/0, and Ginko; then repeat twelve more times to reach end of beadwork. When you reach end of beadwork, step up through 8/0, 11/0, three 15/0s, three 11/0s, three 15/0s, 11/0, and 8/0. (Figure 5)
- **6.** Go through Ginko then repeat * of Step 5 on this side of beadwork. (Figure 6)

MIDDLE EMBELLISHMENT

7. You will need about 1.5 yards of thread for this section. Pick up three 15/0s, 11/0, three 15/0s, and go through next 15/0 and 11/0 on beadwork. Pick up 11/0 and go through next 11/0 and 15/0. Pick up three 15/0s, 11/0, three 15/0s, and go through three 11/0s your thread was exiting at start of step. Retrace thread path skipping under 11/0 located between sets of three 15/0s. This will cause 11/0 to pop to a point. Step up through seven 15/0s, 11/0, 8/0, 11/0, and 15/0. (Figure 7)

- **8**. Pick up three 15/0s, 11/0, three 15/0s, and go through next 15/0 and 11/0 on beadwork. Pick up 11/0 and go through next 11/0 and 15/0. Pick up three 15/0s, 11/0, three 15/0s, and go through next 15/0, and 11/0. Pick up 11/0 and go through next 11/0 and 15/0. Retrace thread path skipping under 11/0 located between sets of three 15/0s. This will cause 11/0 to pop to a point. Step up through seven 15/0s, 11/0, 8/0, 11/0, and 15/0. Repeat all, eleven more times. (Figure 8)
- **9.** Pick up three 15/0s, 11/0, three 15/0s, and go through next three 11/0s on beadwork. Pick up three 15/0s, 11/0, three 15/0s, and go through next 15/0 and 11/0. Pick up 11/0 and go through next 11/0 and 15/0. Retrace thread path skipping under 11/0 located between sets of three 15/0s. This will cause 11/0 to pop to a point. Step up through six 15/0s and three 11/0s. End thread. (Figure 9)
- **10.** Attach clasp using jump rings. (Photo 1)

Enjoy your new bracelet!!
