PASO DOBLE
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Difficulty Level: Intermediate

This classy, interesting bracelet works up quickly on The Ricks Beading Loom. Depending on the color of beads used it would be perfect for evening wear, work attire or just a "kicky day out".

Materials Required: 1 Tube "SuperDuos", 1 tube "SuperUnos", 1 tube "Peanut" beads, one three strand slide lock clasp, 1 spool KO brand beading thread, 2" \#10 beading needle.

Step 1: Warp your Ricks Beading Loom with nine warps, insert your warp separator card. (For more detailed instructions for this step, see the booklet "The Ricks Beading Loom" or the instructions that came with your loom.) See figure 1 below:

Step 2: Sting one SuperDuo (SD), one peanut, one SD, one peanut, one SD, one peanut, one SD and one peanut. Loom these beads as shown in Figure 2 below:

Step 3: String one Super Uno. Needle through the second hole of the first SD strung in step 2 above. Be certain that when you needle through the SD, you are doing so UNDER the warp threads. Note that the Super Uno remains outside the first warp thread. See Figure 3 below:

Step 4: String one SD, needle through second hole of the next SD in the preceding row. Be certain that when you needle through this SD, you do so UNDER the warp threads. See Figure 4 below:

Step 5: String one SD, needle through the next SD in the preceding row. Be certain that when you needle through this SD, you do so UNDER the warp threads. See Figure 5 below:

Step 6: String one SD, needle through the next SD in the preceding row. Be certain that when you needle through this SD, you do so UNDER the warp threads. See Figure 6 below:

Step 7: String one SD and one Super Uno. Needle back through all the beads going over the warp threads as normal. Note that the SD bead fits in between the last two warp threads and the Super Uno hangs outside the last warp thread. See Figure 7 below:

Step 8: String one Super Uno and one peanut bead. Needle through the second hole of the SD strung in step 4 above. See figure 8 Below:

Step 9: String one peanut bead. Needle through the second hole of the next SD in the preceding row. See Figure 9 below:

Step 10: String one peanut bead. Needle through the second hole of the next SD in the preceding row. See Figure 10 below:

Step 11: String one peanut bead. Needle through the second hole of the next SD in the preceding row. String one Super Uno and needle back through all of the beads over the warp thread. See Figure 11 below:

Step 12: String one Super Uno, one SD, one peanut, one SD, one peanut, one SD one peanut, one SD, one peanut and one Super Uno. When positioning these beads between the warp threads, note that the two Super Unos remain outside the first and last warp threads. Loom these beads as normal. See figure 12 below:

Step 13: Repeat steps three through twelve to the end of your project.
Step 14: Attach Clasp: After weaving in the two remaining warp threads, thread your needle onto one of the ending weft threads. Weave your thread around so that it is exiting toward the inside of one of the SD's nearest the edge of the project. Thread one peanut, one Super Uno and one peanut. Needle through one of the end attachment rings on the three strand slide lock clasp, continuing to needle down (away from the clasp) through the peanut, Super Uno and peanut just strung. Needle through SD your thread was exiting before you strung the before mentioned beads, going toward the next ring. Repeat this thread path one more time.

Repeat this step for the other two attachment rings, weave your thread into the body of the project and tie off. See figure 13 below:

Repeat this step for the other component of your clasp.
