

## PAISLEY GINKO COMPONENTS BY LESLIE ROGALSKI

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Paisley Duos and Ginkos play so well together in a simple component that invites variations galore! Mix and match solid colors with different finishes, switch up the orientation, try different ways to end, and add decorative dangles. Pendant, earrings, try them all!

Skill level: Advanced beginner
Techniques: Familiarity with two-holed beads, ending thread, working jump rings


For one pair of HORIZONTAL earrings:
8 Paisley Duos (PD)
8 Ginko beads
40 size $11^{\circ}$ seed beads
20 size $8^{\circ}$ seed beads
2 SKAFI II Cymbal endings
or 2 small closed jump rings
NOTE: Refer to this diagram to understand how to string the Paisley Duos


## Needed for all variations:

1 pair ear wires
Size 12 beading needle
Fireline or WildFire
Scissors or Thread Zap

## MATERIALS

For one pair of VERTICAL earrings:
8 Paisley Duos (PD)
8 Ginko beads
50 size $11^{\circ}$ seed beads
20 size $8^{\circ}$ seed beads
2 small closed jump rings

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## VERTICAL EARRINGS

FIGURE 1
Step 1. On a 24 -inch piece of thread string a stopper leaving a 6 inch tail. String a PD through the concave tip, an $11^{\circ}$, a PD convex tip, a Ginko tip, four $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$, and sew back through the Ginko wide end.

Step 2. String an $11^{\circ}$, a PD concave tip, an $11^{\circ}$, a PD convex tip, an $11^{\circ}$, a Ginko tip end, and four $11^{\circ}$ s. Sew into the Ginko wide end.

Step 3. String an $11^{\circ}$ and sew through all beads again pulling snugly. Knot the working thread and tail. Sew through beads past the knot through the next PD concave tip. Reverse direction and sew through the convex wide end of that same PD.

Step 4. String the tail on a needle, weave in to secure the thread and, and trim.

## FIGURE 2

Step 5. String two $8^{\circ}$ s and sew through all four $11 s^{\circ}$ over the Ginko. String two $8^{\circ}$ s and sew through the wide concave end of the next PD. String an $11^{\circ}$, a Ginko tip, an $11^{\circ}$, an $8^{\circ}$ and an $11^{\circ}$. Sew into the Ginko wide end.

Step 6. String an $11^{\circ}$ and sew through the next PD convex wide end. String two $8^{\circ}$ s and sew through the four $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$. String two $8^{\circ}$ s and sew through the next PD concave wide end.

Step 7. String an $11^{\circ}$, a Ginko top, an $11^{\circ}$, an $8^{\circ}$, and an $11^{\circ}$. Sew into the Ginko wide end and through the PD convex wide end.

Step 8. Sew through the entire thread path again to exit the first $11^{\circ}$ on the top Ginko.

FIGURE 3
Step 9. String four $11^{\circ}$ s and a closed jump ring. Sew back through the fourth $11^{\circ}$. String three $11^{\circ}$ s. Sew through the other $11^{\circ}$ on top of the Ginko. Sew into the Ginko wide end. Repeat thread path to secure (dashed line), weave in the end and trim.

Step 10. Hang an ear wire from the closed ring (or add an open jump ring first for a bit more length).

## HORIZONTAL EARRING

FIGURE 4
Step 11. Follow Steps 1-8 but continue through beads to exit through the first strung two $8^{\circ} \mathrm{S}$, four $11^{\circ}$ s and one more $8^{\circ}$. Turn your component so your thread is exiting at the top.

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FIGURE 5
Step 12. String out through the left leg of a SKAFI II. String an $11^{\circ}$ and sew back through the SKAFI.

Step 13. Sew through the $8^{\circ}$ first exited, through the next four $11^{\circ}$ s and one $8^{\circ}$, and out the other leg of the SKAFI.

Step 14. String an $11^{\circ}$ and sew back through the SKAFI leg and the $8^{\circ}$ exited.
Step 15. Repeat the thread path to secure once more (not shown in the illustration).

Step 16. Weave thread into beadwork and snug up any thread paths that may feel loose. Trim.

Step 17. Hang an ear wire from the closed ring (or add an open jump ring first for a bit more length.)

## ALTERNATE ENDING OPTIONS

## FIGURE 6

Step 18. Follow Steps 1-8 but continue through beads to exit through all four $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$. Turn your component so your thread is exiting at the top.

Step 19. String three $11^{\circ} \mathrm{s}$, an $8^{\circ}$, and a closed ring. Sew back through the $8^{\circ}$. String three $11^{\circ} \mathrm{S}$ and sew through the four $11^{\circ}$ s atop the Ginko.

Step 20. Repeat the thread path through the new beads of Step 19 and exit through the two $8^{\circ}$ s into the beadwork. Secure thread and trim.

## FIGURE 7

TRY THIS!
Add a closed jump ring ending to the bottom of any variation for a dangle-for earrings or a pendant! (Following Steps 19 and 20 of Figure 6.)

DESIGN TIP: Make the bottom ending the same ending version used at the top of your choice of earring (vertical or horizontal) or play with mixing it up.

## For the dangle shown:

Step 25. On a ten-inch thread string an $8^{\circ}$ leaving a 5 -inch tail. Sew through the bottom jump ring. Sew through the $8^{\circ}$. String two $11^{\circ}$ s and the tip of a Ginko. String an $11^{\circ}$, an $8^{\circ}$, and an $11^{\circ}$, and sew into the Ginko wide end. String two $11^{\circ}$ s. Sew through this thread path again. Knot the working thread to the tail. Weave in ends and trim.
