

# 'Paisley Isle' earrings by Debora Hodoyer (CrownofStones)



#### Material

0.5 grams seed beads in size 15° (Miyuki duracoat galvanized light pewter 15-4221)

1 gram seed beads size 11° (Miyuki galvanized burnt cinnamon 11-1085)

6 x seed beads size 8° (Miyuki gold iris satin mix 8-1610)

12 x seed beads size 6° (Miyuki silver lined dyed grey 6-650)

1 gram O-bead/Zero beads ( brass matte)


6 x 3.4mm Drop beads (Miyuki gunmetal)

18 Paisley Duos (Chalk gold luster)

Beading thread size D, needle size 12, scissors, a pair of earwire hooks with spring and ball in golden tone


## Round 1

Use about 3' of thread (90 cm) to string three 6°, then pass back through all beads again to form a tight circle, leaving a short tail. Tie a square knot, weave through beads to hide the knot, then exit from a 6°.




Round 2


String a 6° and sew through next 6° of previous round, then repeat this stitch twice. Continue weaving through beads to fix them in position, then exit from a 6° of this current round.




String an O bead, a Paisley Duo (facing right, larger side, bottom hole), an 11°, a Paisley Duo (facing left, larger side, bottom hole), an O bead and sew through next 6° of previous round.




Repeat this stitch twice to complete the round, then repeat the thread path from the beginning of this round to fix the beads in position. Retrace the thread path and exit from the top hole of first Paisley Duo added in this round.




String three 11° and sew through next 11°; string three 11° and sew through the top hole of next Paisley Duo. String an O bead, a Paisley Duo (facing right, larger side, bottom hole) and sew through the top hole of nearest Paisley Duo.




Repeat this stitch twice to complete the round, then retrace previous thread path to exit from first three 11° added in this round.




String a drop bead and sew through next three 11°; string six 11° and sew through the top hole of following Paisley Duo added in previous round. String three 11° and sew through the top hole of nearest Paisley Duo and through following three 11°.




Repeat these stitches twice, then retrace previous thread path to exit from first six 11° added in this round.



String two 11°, an 8°, two 11° and weave through beads to exit from next group of six 11° added in previous round.



Repeat this stitch twice to complete the round, then retrace previous thread path to exit from first 8° added in this round.



### **Earwire loop**

String an 11°, six 15°, an 11° and sew back through the 8° exited, to form a beaded loop. Repeat the thread path through the loop to reinforce, then secure the thread and trim it. Attach an earwire to the loop, then form another earring repeating these same steps.



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
