

## "Sunny" Pendant

Take advantage of beautiful colors of Miniduo beads and use them to make this unusual and stylish pendant.


## Material (for one pendant):

Matubo Miniduo in three colors ( 5 grams total):

- A (3 grams)
- B and C(1 gram each)

Matubo 8/0 (approx. 5 grams)
Matubo 7/0 (approx. 1 gram)
15/0 Japanese seed beads (approx. 1 gram)
Matubo 11/0 (optional, approx. 0,5 gram)
Miyuki Delica 10/0 (approx. 1 gram)
24 mm Lunasoft or 25 mm glass/gemstone cabochon
Beading needle and thread (Nymo, Fireline)

Difficulty: Intermediate

[^0]When choosing colors, keep in mind that the $11 / 0 \mathrm{~s}$ won't be visible on the front side of the pendant at all and that the 8/0s will only be visible when you look at the pendant from the side. But when it comes to Miniduos, you can get creative. I usually work with three colors las shown in the pattern), but if you want something bolder, you can even make every "ray" in a different color or use mixed colors.


1) String 38 - 40 Matubo 8/0s (depending on your cabochon) and tie a square knot to form a circle.
2) You can try the circle
 around your cabochon. It should fit inside snugly, but comfortably. If necessary, add or remove two beads and try again.

3) Then start beading. Add one new 8/0. Skip the next $8 / 0$ in the row and pass through the second $8 / 0$ in the row (peyote stitch). Keep your tension tight.

Repeat step 3 ...

8) ... until you reach ...
9) ... the end of the row. Again, make the step-up by adding the last Delica, passing through the last 8/0 from the previous row and then through the first Delica from this row.

12) At the end of the row, don't forget the step-up (like in steps 5 or 9 ).

13) If you keep your tension tight enough, two rows of 10/0 Delicas will be enough to hold the cabochon inside.
But if you wish, you can add one more row of peyote stitch with 15/0s ...
14) ... to reinforce the bezel.

At the end of this row you don't need to make the step-up.
11) And again, repeat until you reach the end of the row.

(Before you reach the end of the row, put the cabochon
17) Now we need to close the front side of the cabochon, in a similar way as in steps 6-14.

I usually start with one row of peyote stitch with 11/0s ...
15) Weave through beads to get to the other side of the bezel.
I usually go through the nearest Delica and then the next 8/0 ...
16) ... and then back through the $8 / 0$ that is next to the one the thread is exiting from las shown in the photo).
inside - back side first)

18) ... then two rows of 10/0 Delicas ...
19) ... just like in steps 6-12.

20) Remember, at the end of each row you have to make the step-up!

21) And then you can add one more row of $15 / 0$ s llike in steps 13 and 14). This row is optional - if you feel that the bezel fits nicely on the cabochon, you don't need to add it.


22) When you finish the bezel, get to one of the 8/0s in the "middle" row (as shown in the photo).

23) Add two Miniduos (color A - or literally any color of Miniduos you have on hand - this row will be only visible on the back side of the pendant) and pass through the next 8/0 in the middle row.

24) Repeat step 23 ...
25) ... until you reach ...

26) ... the end of the row.

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27) Make the step-up by passing through the lower hole of the first Miniduo in the row ...
28) ... and then back through the upper hole of the same Miniduo.
29) Pass through the upper hole of the next Miniduo (no new beads added in this step).
30) Add one $8 / 0$ and pass through the upper holes of the next two Miniduos.
31) Repeat step 30 ...

32) ... until you reach the end of the row.
33) Make the step-up by passing through the first 8/0 from this row.
34) Add two 8/0s and pass through the next $8 / 0$ in the row.
35) Repeat step 34 ..

36) ... until you reach the end of the row.

37) At the end of the row make the step-up by passing through the first pair of $8 / 0 \mathrm{~s}$.

38) Add one 7/0 and pass through the next pair of 8/0s.

39) Repeat step 38, until you reach the end of the row.

40) At the end of the row just add the last 7/0 and pass through the two 8/0s. You don't need to make a step-up in this row..

41) Add one $15 / 0$, one MD, one 15/0, one MD, one 15/0, one MD and one 15/0 - so four 15/0s and three Miniduos (one of each color, A, B and C) between them.
42) The thread is exiting from the pair of $8 / 0 \mathrm{~s}$. Pass through the nearest 10/0 Delica that lies right above the next 7/0 (as shown in the photo).

43) This is what you should get.

44) Add one $15 / 0$ and pass back through the free hole of the nearest new Miniduo.


[^3]45) Add one $15 / 0$ and pass through the free hole of the middle new Miniduo.

46) Add one 15/0 and pass through the free hole of the last new Miniduo.


47 Add one 15/0 and then pass through the next pair of $8 / 0$ s in the row.
48) Try to keep your tension as tight as possible. This is what you should get.

49) Repeat steps 42 - 48 ...

50)


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51) ... the end ...

52) ... of the row. Now you can tie a few half-hitch knots and cut off all the remaining thread. The pendant is finished.


[^4]Note: Matubo 11/0s are not visible in the finished pendant, so they won't be listed here. Feel free to use any neutral color of $11 / 0 \mathrm{~s}$ you have on hand.
