

Shiraz bracelet
Make this elegant lacy bracelet with the new Matubo Ginko beads.


## Material (for one bracelet)

Matubo Ginko (approx. 20 pcs)
Matubo Miniduo (approx. 3.5 gram)
Matubo 8/0 (2 pcs)
Matubo 11/0 (approx. 2.1 gram)
15/0 Miyuki seed beads (approx. 1 gram)
3 mm FP beads (approx. 60 pcs)

Beading needle and thread (Nymo, Fireline...)

Difficulty: Intermediate

11) Add one $11 / 0$ and pass through the upper hole of the next Miniduo.

12) Add one $11 / 0$ and pass through the upper hole of the next Miniduo.

13) Add one 3mm FP and one 11/0 and pass through the next 15/0 and 11/0.
14) Skip the next $11 / 0$ and pass through the next 11/0 and 15/0.
15) Repeat steps $10-14$ to complete the row.

17) Since this is the first component, you can add an 8/0 on one side - you will later use this $8 / 0$ to attach a clasp.

The thread should exit from the first 11/0 between the Miniduos (see step 16). Add one 11/0, one 8/0 and one 11/0 and pass through the next 11/0 between the Miniduos. Then you can weave through the last row one more time and then tie a few half-hitch knots and cut off all the remaining thread.
18) Make another component by repeating steps 1 - 16.


[^0]20) Add one $11 / 0$ and pass through the next 11/0, upper hole of the next MD and the next 11/0 on the previous component (as shown in the photo).

21) Add one 11/0 and pass through the corresponding (11/0, MD, 11/0) on the new component.

22) Add one $15 / 0$ and pass through the nearest new 11/0.

26) Pass through the next MD (upper hole) and the next 3 mm FP bead on the new component.

27) Add one 11/0, one 3 mm FP and another 11/0 and go back through the corresponding 3mm FP and MD (upper hole) on the previous component.

28) Pass through the next (11/0, MD, 11/0) ...
29) ... and also through the next MD (upper hole) and the next 3 mm FP on the same component.
30) Add one 11/0, one 3 mm FP and one 11/0 and go back through the corresponding 3mm FP and MD (upper hole) on the new component.

31) Now you can tie a few half-hitch knots and cut off the remaining thread. (I) recommend tying the thread off somewhere between the 15/0s and $11 / 0 \mathrm{~s}$ in the inner circle of the connection)

32) Make another component (steps 1 - 16)..

37) Pass through the next (11/0, 15/0, 11/0).

[^2]38) Add one $15 / 0$ and pass through the next $11 / 0$

39) Add three $15 / 0$ s. Skip the 3 mm FP and pass through the next 11/0 bead. Pull snug.
(This step is optional - if you don't want to add the 15/0s, you can just pass through the 3mm FP and the next 11/0 - see the last page of the tutorial for the photo of the result).

40) Add one $15 / 0$ and pass through the next (11/0, 15/0, $2 \times 11 / 0$ )

41) Repeat steps 37 - 40, until you reach the end of the row.

42) This is what you should get.
43) When you reach the end of the row, just weave through beads to get to the other side of the bracelet lyou should get to the same bead as in steps 36) and then again, repeat steps 37 - 40, until you reach the end of the row.

Then tie a few half-hitch knots and cut off all the remaining thread.

44) Use jump rings to attach a clasp to the $8 / 0$ s on each end of the bracelet.

45) The bracelet is finished.

TIP:
When making the orange bracelet, I skipped the step 39 and instead of adding the three 15/0s, I just passed through the 3mm FP and the next 11/0.
